

4-H Glossary

4-H Achievement Night	See yellow section, County Events page for more information
4-H Ambassadors	Youth ages 13 and above who promote 4-H.
4-H Camp	See yellow section, County Events page for more information
4-H Club	Each member belongs to a club where they participate together and learn parliamentary procedure through a club meeting each month.
4-H Club Day	See yellow section, County Events page for more information
4-H Council	County-wide group which has representatives from all of the clubs.
4-H Member	Any youth between the ages of 7-19 as of January 1.
4-H PDC	4-H Program Development Committee, a group who decides what the goals are for the County 4-H program and what changes should be made.
4-H Project	An area of focus for a member for a particular year. For example: Photography, Foods, Clothing, Sheep, Swine, Beef, Rabbits, Woodworking, and Plant Science.
Banner	A club exhibit promoting 4-H at the county fair. They are judged and the top two are then taken for display at the Kansas State Fair.
Cloverbud	Any youth between the ages of 5-6 as of January 1.
Club Leader	A volunteer adult who is in charge of the organization of a 4-H club. They provide assistance to the 4-H members in the club, at their monthly meetings, when setting goals, and with parliamentary procedure.
Club Seal	A recognition program for each club. A club receives either a purple, blue, red, or white seal. The seal received can be placed on the clubs charter.

Enrollment Card	Each member must fill out an enrollment card each year to enroll to be a 4-H member. On the enrollment card, each member will list which projects they want to be enrolled in.
KAP	Kansas Award Portfolio, Record book form for members ages 10-19.
Kansas 4-H Participation Form	This is a form that must be filled out by each 4-H member. The form has all of the health information for each member.
Kansas State Fair	The State Fair is held in Hutchinson. Any 4-H member who is at least age 9, may exhibit their project as long as they received a purple on their project at the County Fair.
Open Class	A class for a person unable to show their project as a member of the 4-H division
PAA	Project Award Application, record book form for members ages 7-9.
Project Leader	A volunteer who teaches youth about a particular project
VIP	Volunteer Information Profile, the program to verify our volunteers
