Re: Clothing Entry Forms and Judging Information

Summer has arrived and many of you are working on your projects for the Fair. Clothing judging will be on Saturday, July 22 at Wabaunsee High School in the north building. Please enter in the north doors. We will begin with Construction judging at 8:00 a.m. The Fashion Revue Buymanship judging will begin at 9:30 a.m. There will be a female and male dressing room for the participants to change their clothes. The schedule for Buymanship will be emailed out by July 17th.

As stated in the fair book, judging will be in a classroom setting, where the door will open between classes and then shut while judging is occurring. Anyone may enter when the door is open. The public fashion revue will be at the Fair.

All clothing entries must be pre-entered by **July 11th**. Included in this packet are all the clothing forms needed to exhibit at the 2017 Wabaunsee County Fair. Everyone must turn in a clothing pre-entry form, plus the items listed below.

Clothing Construction

The following items are needed for exhibiting a constructed item:

- Green 4-H entry tag, attached to item with a safety pin
- 2½ x 3 in. cloth label including: Name, County, Class Number
- Sew clothing label behind the neck, center back waistband, or left end of apron band

Buymanship Fashion Revue

The following forms are needed for the Buymanship Fashion Revue Section:

- Buymanship Fashion Revue Entry Form – due July 11th
- Cost Per Wear Form for Intermediates & Seniors – due July 11th
- Fashion Revue Script Form – due at judging on July 22nd
- Fashion Revue Check-In Form – bring to Fair check-in on July 29th

All clothing articles, garments, and outfits are to be checked-in on Saturday, July 29th. The Fashion Revue Check-In Form needs to be turned in at check-in. Please bring all garments and outfits on hangers. Feel free to bring a clear plastic cover or garment bag for your clothes to protect them. All outfits must be displayed for the duration of the county fair following the public fashion revue. If you have purchased an outfit for a livestock show, you are more than welcome to wear it to show.

Public Fashion Revue

- The Trinity Ministries Building will be available for changing into your fashion revue outfit.
- You will choose one outfit to model in the public fashion revue.
- Once you have modeled and all awards have been presented, please return your outfit to the Clothing display at the Fair.
- Please hang the ribbon with your outfit and Fashion Revue Check-in Form.

She accessorizes the garment with natural wooden beads and matching earrings. Neutral hose and brown leather pumps complete the outfit.
