These new forms have made record-keeping for your 4-H projects more concise. ZBooks is available for all youth interested in using the ZBooks software! The Permanent Record is included in ZBooks. If you choose to keep records with ZBooks, do not feel like you have to transfer over all of your previous years' activities in to the online Permanent Record. Start this year and attach it to your previous document.



Record Book Judging & Officer Training

Join us for a Sunday afternoon of officer training, record book judging, and fun! 4-H Council has voted to separate officer training from Achievement Night and put a teambuilding focus on it. Whether you are a current club officer or just looking to hone your leadership skills, we want you to attend on September 28 at 3:00 p.m. in the Marlow-Lietz Exhibit Building.

Record Book judging will take place in the Flint Hills Junior Shooters Exhibit Building. We encourage parents to come and go as much as you can to help us get through all of Chase County's books. Being a part of the judging process also helps new families get ideas for next year's projects and the things youth members can do and learn.

A meal will be served at the conclusion of Officer Training. 4-H Council will meet immediately following to elect the 2025-26 Council members. Per the bylaws, 4-H Council officers do not have to be elected from the Club Representatives. If a youth member is interested and meets the criteria below, they are encouraged to attend and run for office. Each club is given two votes.

President: Candidates must be at least 14 years of age and do not intend to graduate before the end of the 4-H year in which they are installed.

Vice President: Candidates must be at least 12 years of age.

Secretary: Candidates must be at least 10 years of age.

Treasurer: Candidates must be at least 10 years of age.

The Presidential AI Challenge

The current presidential administration is launching a year-long challenge for K-12 students across the country to spark interest in Artificial Intelligence, promote creative thinking using AI tools, and demonstrate how AI technology can be used in beneficial ways. Early training and experience in responsible AI use can demystify the technology and support America's youth in cultivating skills and knowledge necessary to thrive in an AI-driven workforce.

Students who join the Presidential Challenge can access training and resources to help them complete a project that can either be a study or the development of an AI method or tool to solve a local community problem. Educators are also invited to participate and focus on creative approaches to teaching or using AI technologies in K-12 learning. Participants can choose to enter their projects into a competition for the chance to showcase their work at a White House event next summer.
