Kansas Kids Lifetime Combination License

The Kansas Kids Lifetime Hunting and Fishing License application is now available! Any resident youth who is 7 years old or younger is eligible for a license at a reduced rate: \$302.50 for those 5 and younger, and \$502.50 for those 6 or 7 years old. (Regular price is \$962.50 for Hunt/Fish lifetime)

Those 7 years old and younger on/after July 1, 2022 are <u>temporarily</u> eligible, so long as their application is completed, submitted and postmarked by December 31, 2022. After December 31, 2022, only resident youth who are 7 years old or younger at the time of application and postmarked date will be eligible.


POSTPONED Youth Entrepreneurship Challenge (YEC)

NEW Horse Updates 2022-23

As participation numbers are declining in the Kansas 4-H Horse project, participation in Kansas 4-H District Horse shows are also declining. Due to the decrease in numbers, beginning in the 2023 4-H Program Year, Kansas 4-H project members who are currently enrolled in the horse project will be eligible to compete at the Kansas State Fair 4-H Show if all the requirements detailed in the attached letter are complete. District Horse Shows will **NO LONGER** be a part of the project. Other changes within the project are that Horse ID Certificates will be due to the Extension Office by **JUNE 1** of the current 4-H program year as opposed to May 1. Beginning in 2023, the Kansas 4-H Horse Achievement Levels will no longer be a requirement to participate at the State Fair.
