

#### \*NEW\* Horse Updates 2022-23

As participation numbers are declining in the Kansas 4-H Horse project, participation in Kansas 4-H District Horse shows are also declining. Due to the decrease in numbers, beginning in the 2023 4-H Program Year, Kansas 4-H project members who are currently enrolled in the horse project will be eligible to compete at the Kansas State Fair 4-H Show if all the requirements detailed in the attached letter are complete. District Horse Shows will **NO LONGER** be a part of the project. Other changes within the project are that Horse ID Certificates will be due to the Extension Office by JUNE 1 of the current 4-H program year as opposed to May 1. Beginning in 2023, the Kansas 4-H Horse Achievement Levels will no longer be a requirement to participate at the State Fair.

<u>BEEF</u> – Including Bucket Calves, Commercial Heifers and Market Heifers/Steers

Weigh-In & Tagging: March 26, 2023 1–3 p.m. @ Jones Family Angus

Tagging Deadline: April 17, 2023, 5:00 p.m.

<u>GOAT, SHEEP, SWINE</u> (All species together) – Includes Commercial and Market animals

Weigh-In & Tagging: May 6, 2023 8–10 a.m. @ Wab Co Fairgrounds

Tagging Deadline: May 26, 2023, 5:00 p.m.

NEW FOR 2023 – If you are unable to attend the designated weigh-in & tagging, please contact the office to schedule a time for Shannon or Stephanie to come tag your animals. No picture submission will be accepted this year. Any animals not tagged by the specie specific deadline will not be eligible to show in the 4-H Division at the Wabaunsee County Fair. Please check the nomination deadlines to have your State Nominated animals tagged.

The Project Report Forms are age specific. All static will use the General Project Report Form and all heartbeat projects will use the Animal **Project Report Form**. These new forms have made record keeping for your 4-H projects more concise. ZBooks is available for all youth interested in using the ZBooks software! The Permanent Record is included in ZBooks. If you choose to keep records with ZBooks, do not feel like you have to transfer over all of your previous years' activities in to the online Permanent Record. Start with this year and attach it to your previous document.
