

Livestock Weigh-In & Tagging Info

Livestock not tagged by their species tagging deadline will show in open class. Weigh-in on Species weigh-in date is required for ROG eligibility.

Other than for 4-H bucket calves, all animals will receive eID tags. Tags are purchased at the time of tagging, please plan accordingly (cash or check only, no cards). An extension Agent will be present during tagging of all Wabaunsee County 4-H livestock.

Updated Swine Rules

We are excited to release the rules for our new Breeding Gilt classes at the 2021 Wab. Co. Fair! Market and Breeding are separate projects in 4HOnline. Please be sure that you are enrolled in the appropriate project(s) for all Livestock!

General Swine Rules:

- 1. Exhibitors may exhibit no more than 3 swine (2 Market and 1 Breeding Gilt or 1 Market and 2 Breeding Gilts).
- 2. Read General and Animal Rules & Regulations on pages 4-6.
- 3. All swine must have been farrowed on or after January 1, 2021.
- 4. Swine must have been tagged with an approved 4-H tag by the local tagging deadline: May 21, 2021.
- 5. Testicles must be removed via physical castration from barrows. No chemical castration is allowed.
- 6. Breeds must have three head for a class or will show as AOB. A Breed Champion will be selected for each breed. A Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion will be selected from breed champions and reserves for Market Hogs and Breeding Gilts. Breed classes will be offered as follows:
 - a. Duroc
 - b. Hampshire
 - c. Yorkshire
 - d. Spot
 - e. Berkshire
 - f. Crossbred
 - g. AOB

Market Hogs:

- Market animals will be weighed and divided into uniform classes according to breed and weight. Official weight will be determined at check in.
- 2. Swine failing to meet the minimum weight of 220 pounds will be shown in a prospect class. These animals will not be allowed to compete for champion placing and will not be allowed to sell in the premium auction.
- 3. Market Swine will be shown according to breed and weight.



Breeding Gilts

- 1. This is a non-terminal show for breeding gilts, they are not eligible to be sold through the auction ring.
- 2. Breeding gilts exhibited by 4-H'ers will be returned home at exhibitors' own risk and the Wabaunsee County Fair and Fair Officials will not be held responsible for the death, injury or spread of disease.
- 3. Registration Certificates and ear notches are required for all purebred breeding gilts. Papers are required at check in and will be checked with ear notches. Papers need to be in the exhibitor's name or approved family nomination name by June 15, 2021. Purebred gilts may be co-owned and co-registered by 4-Her's of the same family, however, may not be co-owned with an adult. Non-papered gilts will show in the Crossbred division.
- 4. Breeding Gilts will be shown according to breed, classes will be broken by age if numbers warrant.

Hosting Japanese Exchange

Looking for some new fun and excitement this summer after a long year of staying home? Host a new friend from Japan in your home this summer, July 23 – August 18. Kansas 4-H International Exchange Programs are offering hosting opportunities for 25-30 families this summer. Host families are needed who would be willing to host a Japanese boy or girl. The Japanese youth will be between the ages of 13 and 15. Our responsibility is to make host family assignments matching each delegate with an American same-gender host sibling as soon as possible so that families and exchange delegates can communicate and get to know each other.

Any Kansas family with children aged 10-16, who is interested in the Japanese culture, may host. A separate bed is required, but not necessarily a separate room from the host sibling. Delegates are 100 percent medically covered with 4-H insurance and bring their own spending money. They can go on host family vacations, camping trips, or join their host sibling for summer camps and the county fair. The focus is everyday family life. The fillable PDF Project Report forms are being used state-wide across all age levels for 2020/2021. ONLY Extension Units in the Pilot will have access to online record keeping in ZBooks. The New Family Notebooks (updated 10/2020) have the updated Guide to Kansas 4-H Project Recognition.

ZBooks will not be available to Wabaunsee County during the 2020-2021 4-H year.

The Project Report Forms are age specific. All static will use the <u>General Project Report Form</u> and all animal projects will us the <u>Animal Project Report Form</u>. These new forms have made record keeping for your 4-H projects more concise. Now is the time to start filling in your goals and a timeline for you to complete them.
